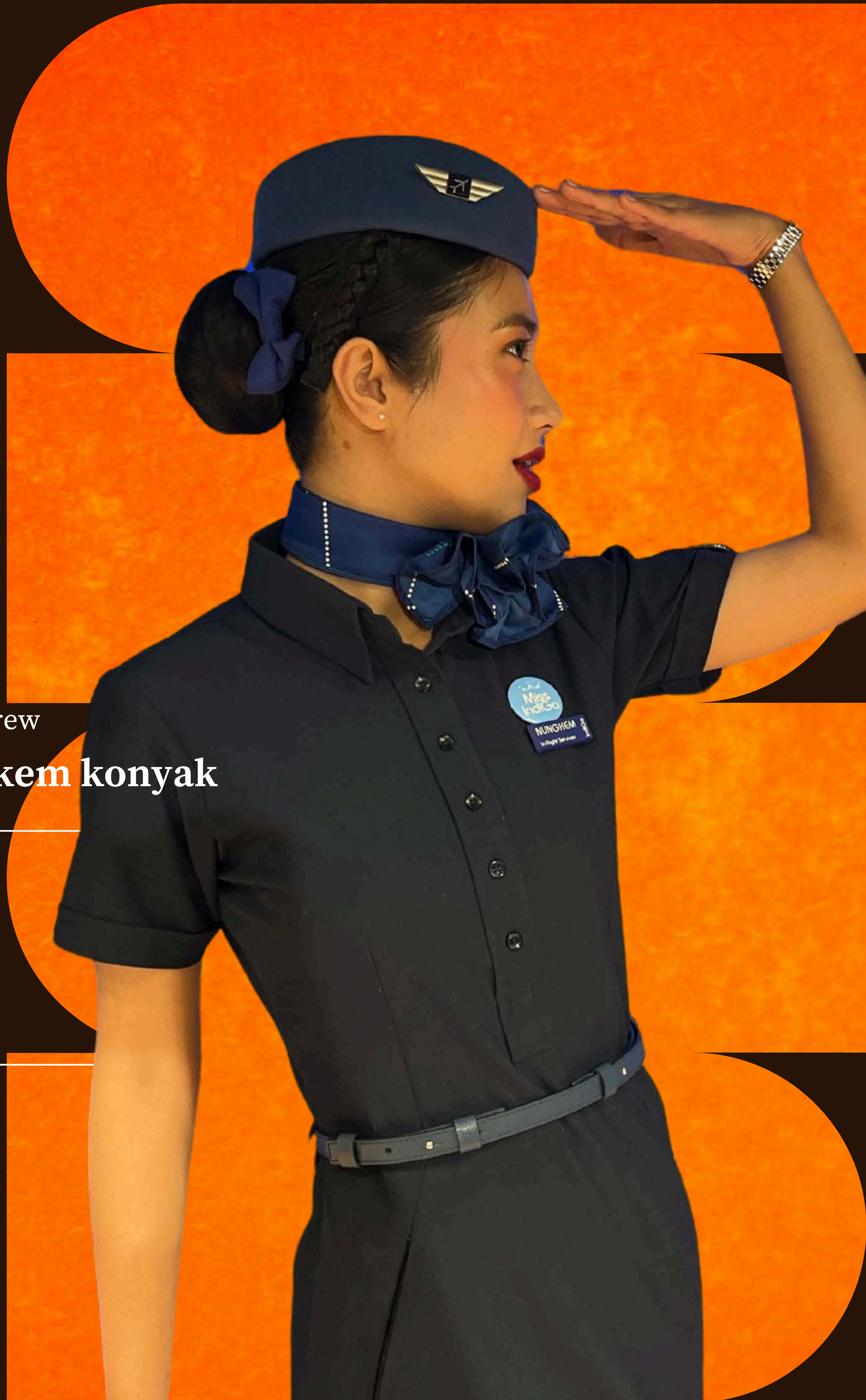

FROM THE DEO

What are the current employment opportunities available in Nagaland, especially for fresh graduates and skilled youth?

Beyond employment under Government sector, opportunities are available in sectors like Hospitality, Health, Customer Service, Personal Maintenance, Education, Sports, Self-employment, and Entrepreneurship

How is the government addressing the issue of rising unemployment in both urban and rural areas of the state?

Government has been taking several steps. Policies are being designed to provide Skilling and Training to ensure better livelihood opportunities. Government is constantly improving market linkages and availability of Credits. It is also addressing target specific groups such as women, youth, and economically weaker sections of the society through line departments.

Are there any specific skill development or vocational training programs initiated by the state government to enhance youth employability? If yes, how does the government monitor the effectiveness and track the progress and outcome of these programs

Yes, in addition to implementing Central Sponsored Schemes related to skilling, the state government has successfully launched 'Mobile Skill Morung' initiative under SANKALP to bridge the gap for rural skilling and training. Recently, the Nagaland Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Mission has been launched. Vocational training programs are being offered in Government ITIs (Industrial Training Institute) across 9 districts in Nagaland.

The government is tracking the progress of trainees through a 'placement cell' which every institute and training partners are made to keep record of.

What role do private sector partnership and entrepreneurship play in improving the employment scenario in Nagaland?

What kind of career guidance or counselling service are available for students and job seekers through the department?

Under the National Career Service (NCS), a project of Ministry of Labour & Employment, District Employment Exchange (Model Career Centre) Dimapur offers various career guidance and counselling services for students and jobseekers. Here are some of the services available:

- Career Guidance Sessions: Individual and group guidance sessions are conducted to help individuals choose their career paths and provide personalized guidance.
- Job Fairs and Placement Drives: Regular job fairs and placement drives are organized in partnership with various companies, providing opportunities for jobseekers to interact with potential employers.
- Resume Building and Interview Preparation: Expert guidance is provided to help jobseekers create effective resumes and prepare for interviews.
- Career Counselling: Trained counsellors are available to provide one-on-one counselling sessions, helping individuals identify their strengths and interests.
- Vocational Guidance: Guidance is provided on various vocational courses and training programs available.
